
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# Impact - In this course, what impact did the following have on your learning after Spring Break (once your classes stopped meeting in person):



### Comments

Professor Sherriff did a great job with dealing with the shift to remote instruction. His method of uploading a series of shorter videos covering a variety of topics worked well.

Professor Sherriff made this class the most enjoyable and adaptable out of all of my CS classes at UVA. His willingness to accept suggestions enhanced the learning experience.

Best course transition to online I had this semester. Sherriff did a REALLY great job at modifying expectations to make the course manageable, and put in an incredible amount of effort to have the majority of our grades in for the deadline between letter grades/credit.

Prof. Sherriff handled the shift exceptionally well. He kept his humor and interacted with the class in innovative ways. Recorded lectures allowed me to view lectures on my own time and live Q&A sessions allowed for questions to be answered. He made himself exceptionally available to us and was never too busy. We didn't miss a beat and I felt like I learned all the material.

Remote instruction was made more challenging having to be outside a learning environment.

Sherriff's transition to online learning was practically seamless. He started posting lectures to YouTube almost immediately, and adjusted the schedule as necessary. What an absolute unit. There were no challenges at all!

It was harder not to meet in person to resolve issues that we might have had. Luckily, we did not run into major problems that couldn't be fixed remotely from each other.

Fortunately, the move to remote instruction did not affect this course at all, possibly due to how fast the instructor was able to get information out and update students. We were given an "adjustment week", the project requirements became more lenient, and online lectures rolled out almost immediately on Youtube. Honestly, out of all my classes, watching the Youtube lectures for this class felt the least like watching a lecture. Instead, they were very fun and engaging (perhaps even more engaging than in person lectures...?), possibly due to the flexibility of online lectures. I was able to watch whenever I wanted, take notes however I wanted, and pause if I needed to. As for the project, since a lot of it is based on remote teamwork, my team did not have any problems and we were still able to complete our project successfully. The instructor for this course did an amazing job of shifting to online while taking stress off of students' shoulders.

However, I feel that the quizzes were definitely more work than they were implied to be (ie not taking 30–45 min but closer to 20 min per question). I understand you gave us longer to do them, but I think you should consider the balance between longer—duration—more—intense quizzes and shorter—duration—more—to—the—point quizzes. Overall, I feel like the quizzes seemed slightly unfair in their expectations, though some questions were definitely much more manageable than others. Overall, I am so glad I took this class and feel like I have finally gotten at least a taste of software engineering. The project is a really great experience and I am glad to have had a team that made me able to learn so much even though there was no formal training on the technologies used.
