



Comments The only thing I was required to do was read the write-ups, finish the guizzes and complete the final exam. The assignments with suggestions of what to try during office hours each week helped me develop best practices for my office hours. This course was entirely text-based, from one website The class was mostly asynchronous where students read/listen to the material for the week. It was very straightforward and I like that I can do it at my own pace and time. Since the course mostly consisted of asynchronous videos, those were what contributed to my learning in the course. Tychonievich is a master of his craft, and these videos turned out highly informative. I learned a lot from taking what Prof Tychoneviech taught us and applying it to my actual TAing experience Most of the class was just write-ups I had to read but the quizzes were a good way for me to learn the material. Seeing the posts from other TAs on Discord provided me with tips on how I could improve my teaching abilities. The recorded lectures provided most of the learning while the hands-on activities and quizzes helped ensure and enforce understanding. The lectures really helped me become a better TA. The recorded lectures were clean and concise. The recorded lectures and write-ups were very helpful. The activities were a mixed bag as far as effectiveness goes I enjoyed the format of video lectures and writeups being two mediums for the same content. the discord was very helpful for viewing other TA experiences and helped me gain a better understanding of how to interact with students Writeups were very well written. The recorded lectures were thorough, enthusiastic, and informative. The write-ups of the course content posted on the course website were my primary resource during the class and were excellent. I thought that the way this class was structured did well in preparing us to be TA's. It made sure that we knew all the content, but it didn't add too much of a strain to our schedules. I also thought that the recorded lectures, the website, and the other resources offered to us was diverse and effective. The recorded lectures were very informative and helpful. I felt that many of the topics covered were very applicable to my experience as a TA. Having the discord server was also a nice way to interact with other students, ask questions, and learn about other people's experiences. The lectures were fun to watch. I enjoyed seeing the visuals that went along with them. This class was just a TA Praticum and I watched video lectures and completed guizzes each week. It was really nice to have both the small video lectures that explained the concepts and concrete little activities we could do that applied the knowledge from the course. 





Prof. Tychonievich gave everyone the opportunity to share via the class discourse.

discord where people gave tips

On the online discussion board (Discord in this case), Prof. Tychonievich addresses and welcomes all TAs' questions about TA-ing and give prompt, helpful responses.

Instructor wrote lectures with the specific intent of making sure that diverse perspectives are treated with respect and welcomed. He made a point of ensuring that TAs focus on this kind of inclusivity.

The goal of the course is to make you a more effective instructor for students of any background. Professor Tychonievich had lectures regarding stereotypes and biases and working with students from different backgrounds, all of which help to create an environment for the CS department as a while that respects differences.

One of the topics we focused on was how a TA can strive to make all students feel comfortable. By including this topic, Prof Tychonievich inherently showed that he respected differences.

Professor Tychonievich was open to hearing different perspectives of teaching.

The instructor taught about and encouraged actions and words that exhibited respect for difference and opening towards diverse perspectives.

The teaching of different perspectives for how people learn and how an instructor or TA can work with those different perspectives.

Whole class was about confronting our biases and understanding differences in opportunity

Had a discord where students were able to share their thoughts and questions

We had multiple units specifically addressing how to be a good TA for a diverse student body

He had a discussion board for this exact purpose. He had us post analogies, questions and advice, all from our diverse perspectives, as we were all TA's for different classes.

He literally taught us how to make sure to be accomodating of students with diverse backgrounds.

One of our units was specifically focused around diversity.

Taught with multiple approaches

There was a section for diversity and respecting each students. Clearly taught section of the curriculum involving this said topic.

A portion of the course was on how to foster an environment that supports diverse perspectives. I found this portion of the course to be extremely enlightening. I also appreciated the discord channel that we had. I feel like this facilitated conversation and allowed an opportunity to shape instruction/advice to what was needed.
