







The website's materials and supplemental lectures were helpful in understanding how to be a better TA.



Comments

This topic was incorporated into our curriculum and the professor was clear about a welcoming environment.

There was a specific lecture about how to be a good TA in terms of dealing with stereotypes and encouraging students to do their best given any stereotypes. Showed dedication to the topic of diversity of demographics as well as fostering a good learning environment for students coming from all different circumstances and environments

The whole class is about learning how to communicate and interact with other people, especially from a student–teacher dynamic, so understanding and respecting differences is a key component of that.

The Discord channels were effective at providing a forum for TAs in all CS courses to provide advice that would be applicable to all TAs regardless what class they help teach.

Professor Tychonievich always encouraged people to come to his live class sessions, which made me feel as though he was really welcoming of our thoughts and opinions.

Students had an open channel of communication in Discord.

Open ended final essay topic.

Taught me about stereotype threat and how to avoid it, and structured the coursework in accordance with those principles, like not bringing up specific hobbies or stereotypes or groups of people, even though these would be useful examples.

Many lessons were about respecting diversity
