• Consequently, ask them to start **talking** to each other to write on the other side of the strip 3 things which they have in common (ie. hobbies, experience, food, places, interests).

• After that, participants will pair up with their other neighbor to repeat the same differences and similarity on the 2nd strips.

• Start a chain by overlapping and stapling together the ends of one strip. Pass the staple to each person and ask the participants to add their two strips to the chain. Continue until all students have added their strips to the chain.
